Welcome to term 5! I hope everyone enjoyed some sunshine over the Easter break. I can't believe we are already in term 5, this year is flying by! We have lots of fab learning planned including our first class trip for the children and we hope to be able to take lots of our learning outside now the weather is more cheerful.

What will we be learning?

We will be kicking off the term with our new book 'The Night Pirates' by Peter Harris. I'm sure the children will love creating all things pirates! We will be dressing up as pirates and venturing onto the Matthew for a trip around the harbour later in the term. I will send a letter with details soon. In phonics we will be consolidating phase 4. We are switching to a new phonics scheme (Unlocking Letters & Sounds) and so there are a few new blends to learn and you may notice some slightly different resources. We will also learn and perform a new class poem- this has been a big hit with the children!

In maths we will be focussing on addition and subtraction as well as doubling, sharing and grouping. We will learn about odd and even numbers and we will explore numbers beyond 10.

Forest school

We had so much fun playing in the woods with our partners at the end of term! We will continue to go each Friday afternoon. Last term we made woodland wands, we built a damn in the stream and we created artwork in the style of Andy Goldsworthy.
